PURPOSE OF PROGRAM

Structural welding is a one year certificate program designed to prepare students for the American Welding Society structural welding qualification test, a national certification. Students will have the opportunity to develop skills in the shielded metal arc welding process that will allow them to sit for the test. Students will be presented information on the materials being used, hand and power tools for the job, safety in the workplace, and the correct procedures for the tasks assigned.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Graduates of the program may find employment opportunities with industrial contractors, ship yards, machine shops, fabrication shops, and manufacturing facilities.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Completion of a four-year high school program or a state high school equivalency certificate is required for admission into the program. Two years of math are required, with algebra I & II and geometry desired. A rolling admissions policy affords candidates the opportunity to apply and be considered for acceptance throughout the year, but early application (9-10 months prior to the school year) is recommended because of competition and strict enrollment capacities established for each program.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The following procedures constitute the admissions process:

- 1. An application form must be submitted accompanied by a nonrefundable \$20 application fee.
- 2. An official high school transcript must also be submitted (current seniors' transcripts should include completed ranking periods).
- 3. GED test scores must be submitted by applicants who are not high school graduates.
- 4. Official college transcripts must be submitted by applicants who have attended other colleges or post-secondary schools.
- 5. Placement testing or appropriate SAT scores, individual interviews and campus tours are required, in most cases, prior to being admitted.
- 6. Admissions decisions are made as quickly as possible once a candidate's file is complete.
- 7. Accepted applicants are required to make a deposit within thirty days of acceptance. Students requesting on campus housing are required to submit an additional deposit to reserve space in the residential complex.
