The College


Northern Maine Community College is an accredited, two-year college that...

- offers 37 associate degree and certificate-level programs.
- provides specific job skills that help students enter the workforce, while ensuring a well-rounded education through general education core requirements.
- prepares students to transfer to a four-year college or university to complete a bachelor's degree and has agreements in place to maximize the transfer of credits.
- offers short-term courses and workshops to enhance the skills of employees.
- has an off-campus center in Houlton.

Our Students

For the 2018 Fall Semester...

- NMCC had 805 full and part-time students.
- 97% of graduates are employed, continuing their education, or both.
- 82% of graduates are working in their field with the average salary at \$38,009.
- 86% of graduates are working in the State of Maine.
- 66% of graduates are working in Aroostook County.
- Students range in age from 15 to 66 with the average age being 25.
- Students come from across the state, out of state, and other countries. 75% are from Aroostook County.



Financial Aid

- Approximately 75% of all NMCC students receive some form of financial aid; 87% of full-time students get financial aid.
- ~ About 95% of students who apply for aid get it.

Residence Halls

Diverse housing options are available:

Andrews Hall: residence hall with double and single rooms *Snow Hall:* suite-style housing *The Quads:* 4-person units

Counseling

Counseling staff assist students in personal and academic endeavors. NMCC was able to expand its counseling staff as the result of a federal Student Support Services grant. The TRiO program provides assistance to first-generation college students, students with disabilities, and students with low incomes.

Computer Resources

Computers are located in the library, academic success center and throughout the campus for student use. Additionally, wireless network access is available in all academic, dining and residence facilities. There is a campus portal that allows the campus community 24-hour access to vital college information, including class schedules, financial aid, degree audits, grades and more. All members of the campus community are provided a campus e-mail account, which is used as the primary means of communication.

Flexible Class Locations/Times

In addition to the college's main campus in Presque Isle, NMCC offers its courses at various off-campus locations around the County as well as online. A wide range of credit and non-credit courses are also offered in the evening, on weekends and during the summer.

Continuing Education

Continuing education programs, courses and seminars are offered to train, retrain or upgrade occupational or academic skills, whether for employment, to improve on-the-job performance or to enhance opportunities for advancement. These programs are offered on campus or at the business or industry site. Customized training is available upon request. Worth Noting...

Accreditation

NMCC is accredited by the New England Commission on Institutions of Higher Education. Several departments or programs on campus are also accredited through organizations specific to their field:

• The business technology department is accredited by the Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs for the business administration and accounting programs.

• The automotive collision repair, automotive technology and diesel hydraulics programs are NATEF (National Automotive Technicians Education Foundation) accredited and meet the National Institute for Automotive Excellence (ASE) standards of quality for the training of technicians in those fields at the masters level.

• The precision machining technology program is accredited by the National Institute for Metalworking Skills (NIMS), the organization which establishes national industry skill standards in metalworking.

• The associate degree nursing program is approved by the Maine State Board of Nursing, and accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing.

• The Emergency Medical Services program is nationally accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs upon recommendation of the Committee on Accreditations of EMS Professions. Maine EMS has designated NMCC as an EMS Training Center.

• The Medical Assisting program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs upon the recommendation of Medical Assisting Education Review Board.
