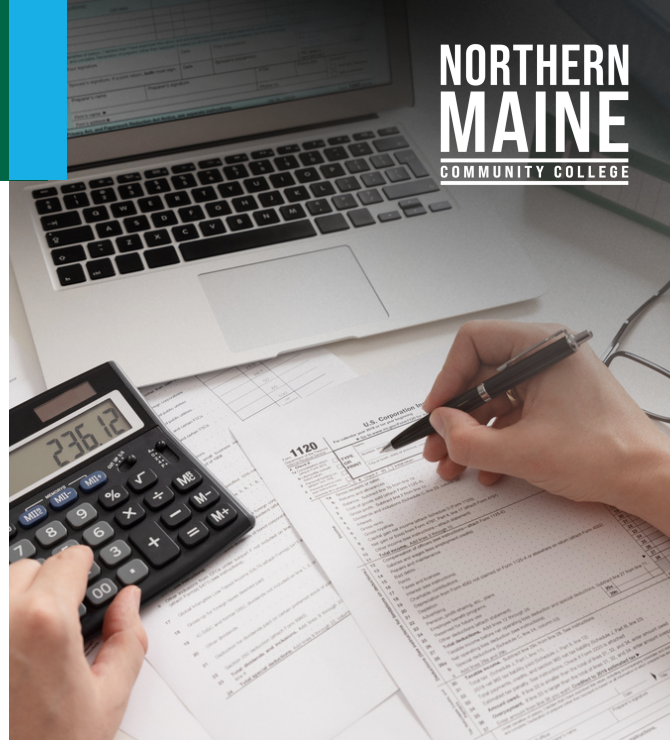

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- 4** If SAT scores are not available, placement testing may be required.
