

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION



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PROGRAM PURPOSE

NMCC's early childhood education program offers both a two-year associate degree and a one-year certificate level option. The associate degree program is designed to educate childcare professionals in the skills and knowledge necessary for advanced positions in organizations and agencies that serve children. It provides courses and field experience in childcare, as well as a well-rounded supporting education. It also provides transfer opportunities to work towards a bachelor's degree. The certificate program provides the training needed for entry-level positions and meets the more immediate need for those who do not choose the additional courses required for the degree. The core courses of this program align with the educational requirements for the State of Maine Child Development Assistant (CDA) credential.

TRANSFER AGREEMENT WITH UNIVERSITY OF MAINE AT PRESQUE ISLE

As a means to provide a smooth transition for NMCC's Associate of Applied Science Early Childhood Education students, NMCC and UMPI have entered into an agreement which recognizes the compatibility of the curriculums. This agreement allows qualified graduates from NMCC's Early Childhood Education Program to be accepted into UMPI's Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education, Early Childhood Education option.

Graduates can transfer to a four-year school and obtain their bachelor's degree in the same amount of time.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Graduates of this program will find employment opportunities in:

- child care centers
- nursery schools
- public schools
- one-on-one aide positions
- summer and day camps
- pre-school programs
- recreational centers
- other agencies that serve children

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The following procedures constitute the admissions process:

- 1. Submit an NMCC application along with a \$20 application fee.
- Submit official high school transcript and/or HiSET/GED scores (current senior's transcript should include completed ranking period grades).
- 3. Official college transcripts for applicants who have attended other post-secondary schools.
- 4. If SAT scores are not available, placement testing may be required.
- 5. Individual interview required.
- 6. A campus tour is highly recommended.
- 7. Applicants are required to submit a request for a Maine DHHS Child Protective Service record search.

Note: Criminal history record search will be completed by NMCC personnel. Prior criminal convictions may preclude program admission or licensure.
